The Stewardship Way of Life is promoted and lived out at Blessed Trinity Parish. Those committed to the Stewardship Way of Life are strong active Catholics who have pledged **to participate at one of the weekend Masses**, are involved in one or more ministries of the parish and make a weekly offering (10% of your gross household income to the church at Mass).

Those families who fully embrace the Stewardship Way of Life, according to the above definition, and who are 100% current in their commitment to the church, do not pay tuition. They are responsible for the fees listed above and their tithe to the church.

Students enrolled in extended care, athletics, or other after school activities will be assessed additional fees.

Scholarships

Blessed Trinity participates in several scholarships, the **McKay Scholarship** for students with disabilities, **Step Up for Students, Family Empowerment, and AAA**, which are all income-based.

The **McKay Scholarship** program provides scholarships for eligible students with disabilities to attend an eligible private school of their choice. A student must have either a current IEP (Individual Educational Plan) or a 504-plan developed by the public-school system. If your child receives special ed services, has been tested, or has an IEP or 504 plan, please indicate this on the student application. You will also need to provide a copy of the IEP or the 504 plan. While Blessed Trinity strives to accommodate the needs of our students, we may not be able to fulfill a McKay student's special needs. Step Up for Students, Family Empowerment and AAA are income-based scholarships. The scholarships are funded by Florida corporate taxes. Corporations may redirect taxes they pay to the state of Florida to the Step Up for Student or AAA Scholarship. In return, they receive tax credit. To qualify for the Step Up or AAA scholarship, a child entering kindergarten must be 5 on or before Sept. 1 and their household income must meet the published income guidelines. In the registration process, you will be asked to complete an income survey. This survey has several purposes; one is to help us determine if your family could qualify for Step Up or AAA. These scholarships are extremely popular and time sensitive. If we determine your family could qualify for the program, you will be required to complete the scholarship application online, provide the necessary financial documentation required and meet all deadlines published by the scholarship administrator.
